EVENING PRAYER WITH HOLY EUCHARIST

Join us Tuesday evening October 23 at 6pm in the Chapel to celebrate the Feast of St. James of Jerusalem.

James of Jerusalem is referred to in the New Testament as the brother of Our Lord Jesus Christ, although not one of the original twelve Apostles. Later traditions refer to him as James the Just, and was for many years the leader of the Christian congregation in Jerusalem, to which Paul was also affiliated. Confusion has arisen over his identity because he has often been mistaken for St. James, son of Alphaeus. Exactly what the biblical Galatians 1:19 means by designating him "the Lord's brother" is also uncertain, although he is mentioned elsewhere in the Gospels as one of Jesus' four brothers (Mark 6:3; Matthew 13:55). Hypotheses have been forwarded that James and Jesus were brothers, stepbrothers, or cousins.

James evidently was not a follower of Jesus during his public ministry. Paul attributes James's later conversion to the appearance of Christ resurrected (1 Corinthians 15:7).
